Ribes magellanicum



Common name: Uvilla, Parilla, Magellanic currant

Height: 1,5-3 m

Growing: medium

Foliage: deciduous, green shiny leaves.

Flowers / Fruits: edible dark red to black fruits and creamy white flowers.

Site: sun to light shade

Soil: acidic to slightly alkaline

Irrigation: regular

Hardiness: semi-hardy -8 -10°C

Long description: Ribes magellanicum also known as Magellanic currant, is a deciduous Chilean shrub originating from one of Patagonias most beautiful areas; Tierra del Fuego. Magellanic currant has shiny green leaves and bears long tassels of creamy white to yellowish flowers, followed by dark red to black edible berries.
